

DECLARATION OF THE
INDEPENDENT STATES OF
AMERICA

When in the course of the human events, it becomes necessary for one people to declare their independence, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and of nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, — That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.

Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly, we have suffered the longest continuance of a Government under a King, whose character was at first known to us by the true light of the British Constitution.

But when a long train of abuses, usurpations, going on without interruption, has evinced a design to reduce us to absolute Tyranny, it is our duty to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for our future Liberty.

Now, therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress assembled, solemnly publish this Declaration, that these United States are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States; that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as a free and independent State, they have full power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, enter into Commercials, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do.

In Witness whereof, the Representatives of the United States of America, have hereunto set their hands and seals, the third day of September, in the second year of the Independence of the said United States.
